1. General Welcome and Approval of May 26, 2021 SAC Meeting Minutes (2020/2021 SAC Chairs)

- Andrea welcomed everyone
- Naz moved to approve the minutes from the May 26, 2021 SAC meeting; seconded by Lisa

2. Principal's Report (Adam Thompson)

- Adam spoke about the phenomenal staff at the school, including the following new staff:

- Adam indicated that FHPS received an increase in staff allocation from 0.5 to 1.0 in the area of Special Needs
- Adam reported that he will be sending out weekly communications every Friday
- Adam announced that there may be some re-organization in classrooms due to the difference between actual and projected school enrolment, which will impact grades 5 and 6, and possibly other grades as well

- He explained that he will receive updated information from the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) on Monday afternoon, and that following consultations during the week, he will communicate any changes by Friday, aiming for minimal disruptions
- Adam reported that there are now 11 cohorts with 5 larger zones at recess, which is resulting in fewer interactions between groups

3. Vice-Principal's Report (Denyse Stewart)

- Denyse explained that based on a program from the TDSB that families can opt into, all grade 5 students will be receiving devices (laptops) that they can use in school and at home during their time as a TDSB student
 - She indicated that she will look into whether or not the devices have firewalls, as that would impact safety and security when the devices are being used at home
 - She stated that FHPS is currently doing an inventory of the laptops in the school, and trying to ensure that devices previously loaned out to families are returned
 - There was a preliminary discussion about the possibility of money from the school budget and /or SAC fundraising being used to purchase additional devices
- Denyse indicated that new library resources are coming in to make the Learning Commons space most helpful for students
- Denyse noted that they have ordered RazKids for Kindergarten to grade 3, which is an online reading resource program
- Denyse explained that there is a big need for lunchroom supervisors, and anyone interested in this paid position should contact the school ASAP
- Denyse added that the school is focusing on the students' mental health and wellbeing needs
 - She reported that there are many students experiencing anxiety and difficulties adjusting
 - She stated that the school social worker, Suzy Brotman, comes in weekly to consult with staff and work with families, which is a great help

4. Vice-Principal's Report (Jordan Applebaum)

- Jordan stated that the school is waiting for guidance about which clubs and teams will be allowed to begin, given COVID-19 restrictions, though students in grades 7 and 8 will begin first, as more of them are likely to be vaccinated than younger students who are ineligible for vaccination at this time
 - He noted that the following clubs have begun or will soon begin (a Google Form will be sent out to sign up): Yearbook, Young Black Leaders, and Equal Rights Gender Sexuality Alliance

- Jordan reported that as tomorrow is Orange Shirt Day and the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, students will participate in a virtual assembly and various different activities
- Jordan reminded attendees that Selam Debs will be presenting an anti-racism and anti-oppression workshop on October 6th at 6:30 (virtual), an event funded by SAC last school year, but scheduled for this school year as families were thought to be too busy at the end of the previous school year
- Jordan announced that the Terry Fox Run was exciting, safe, and successful, having raised over \$1,000

5. Treasurer's Update (Amit Goel)

- Amit reported that the School Education Fund contains approximately \$83,000
 - It was clarified that this includes \$31,137 that was previously raised for the auditorium restoration project, and thus, is earmarked for that purpose, whereas the rest of the money raised previously should be spent
- Amit also stated that the School Council Fund contains \$2.000
